

## Secretary's Message





## Introduction

**A non-profit, non-governmental and independent humanitarian organization** registered under the Societies Registration Act-1860, **Param Shakti Peeth (PSP)** has been tirelessly working since its inception in 1992 to mainstream the “isolated” members of the society (prioritizing children & women) and mitigate other socio-economic inequalities prevailing in India that are detrimental to inclusive development and also impede the growth of the nation as a whole.

It is common knowledge that the benefits of the nation’s growth have not reached out to a vast section of the society. These “isolated” members in fact form a sizable part of our total population and unless they are not included in the mainstream economy, the growth of our nation shall remain lopsided and, therefore, unsustainable. Sharing this common concern was a group of people from diverse backgrounds and professional disciplines who then founded PSP to serve as a vehicle for ‘inclusive growth’ by bringing the “isolated” members into the ambit of mainstream economy.

The collective experience, insight and diverse perspectives of the founders have been the foundation of our belief that welfare and empowerment of children and women, especially of the marginalized communities, are critical for bridging the societal disparities and alleviating poverty. They have also been the source of our holistic approach to development and in creating the framework necessary to meet the central goal of the organization.

The vision and the mission of the founders are shared throughout the organization with a sense of responsibility, enthusiasm and perseverance, which have also become the core values of PSP.

In our 2+ decades of history, we have been working with and for the community, with special focus on children, women & elderly, through a gamut of diverse grass-root interventions. Adopting different on-ground formats and leveraging the diversity of our team & portfolio and our sheer passion for community development, we continue to be touched by the plight and challenges being experienced by the underprivileged and in-turn continue to touch some of these lives through our myriad interventions.

We acknowledge that our human capital is the single largest factor and the driving force behind our grass-root interventions. The strong governance, diverse & aggregate experience of senior management and a young team enable us to set and subsequently achieve ambitious goals & targets. More importantly, the passion and responsibility of creating a just society is shared throughout PSP.

## Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees with its ten (10) members is the apex decision making body at PSP. It comprises of distinguished individuals coming from diverse sectors and backgrounds. The multi-sectoral competencies and rich aggregate experience provide for a unique perspective from which to draw and thereby extend a holistic and functional approach to all our programs, works and activities. The Board meets every quarter, on pre-determined dates, or on need basis, to decide on matters and issues pertaining to the ongoing programs and for furthering the aims & objects of the Society.

## Senior Management Team

A Senior Management Team is also in place for the purpose of project planning and execution. This team comprises of Program Heads and other senior staff, who have been serving the communities through PSP for

periods ranging from 5-15 years and more in their overall exposure in the field. In addition to project management, this team also plans and strategizes for new program opportunities for organizational growth.

## Human Resources

Owing to the goodwill PSP commands with all the stakeholders and in general, we have managed to gain and retain a young and motivated team of professionals thereby adding to our intellectual wealth. Other than having the desired / technical skill-sets we want people joining us to be passionate about community development to help accelerate our community development initiatives and programs. Starting with a handful of employees the organization currently has a strong backing of over 200 full-time and around 100 part-time professionals / volunteers.

## Our Programs

While we have been involved since the very beginning in 1992 in different programmatic areas, child and women welfare have throughout remained our thrust areas. The following are some of the key programs and activities that are being carried out from the past or undertaken within this fiscal year :-

### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

#### Flagship Project: family based rehabilitation of abandoned children, destitute women & widows

Our flagship program, conceptualized by our President, that uniquely dovetails 3 different welfare schemes in a manner that conclusively meets the physical, social & psychological needs of all the target groups viz., orphan/abandoned children, destitute women and the aged. The beneficiaries, otherwise coming from different backgrounds, caste and ethnicity, are brought together and raised as close-knit families (Vatsalya Parivar). The 52-acre **VatsalyaGram** campus at Vrindavan offers a full range of critical network of support starting from Shelter & Sustenance, Education (for children; up to Sr. Secondary level), Healthcare (a mix of modern medicine and traditional therapy), Literacy & Vocational Training (for girls & women) and other need-based works aimed at reducing the daily struggle of the program beneficiaries and nurture them as a resilient community with the overarching goal of their participation in the nation's economic process.

## VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

With a strong family environment in place, the psychological and social needs as well as many of the other requirements of each group of beneficiary are conclusively met. The loving and protective home provides for a complete family and this itself acts as a healing process for the destitute women. The infants and children, either orphaned or abandoned, no longer remain so and have a family of mother, aunt and grandmother to offer them selfless love and oodles of care.

The uniqueness of **VatsalyaGram** however doesn't end here. It stretches beyond and provides a complete array of benefits, services and programs to ensure that practically every need of the beneficiary groups is addressed, that too in a manner wherein they actively participate and positively contribute to the program's eco-system.

## Centre for Children w/special needs

### Vaishishtyam-VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

Vaishishtyam : Centre for children with special needs – the latest initiative at **VatsalyaGram**, is established to provide a comprehensive gamut of critical services to its beneficiaries (children with Autism, Dyslexia, ADHD, Down Syndrome, other psychological disabilities).

Equipped with all relevant infrastructure viz., Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Vocational Training, Resource Rooms etc., and managed by a passionate & trained team, Vaishishtyam endeavours to help reduce the daily struggle of its beneficiaries (currently 82 in all incl. resident children w/special needs) through individually planned and systematically monitored interventions, which are designed to help these children achieve a higher level of self-sufficiency.



### Centre for Children w/special needs

During the year, and with the objective to encourage a better understanding of people affected with disabilities and to raise awareness about the benefits of integrating disabled persons into every aspect of life, from economic, to political, to social and cultural, Vaishishtyam organized and hosted a 3-day event (from 1st to 3rd Dec., 2015) to commemorate the World Disability Day (3rd Dec.) or the International Day of People with Disability.

And we wanted to make it really, really special, not just for the 80+ children at Vaishishtyam but from other similar Schools and Centres in and around Mathura region (Army Special School, Rajesh Pilot School). Around 1000 children, hundreds of trainers & faculty, participated in the 3-day event which included a gamut of activities (sports, cultural, painting and other competitions, etc.) to encourage these children to showcase their talent and abilities.

The closing ceremony on Day-3 witnessed distribution of prizes & medals and disability aids (wheel-chairs, tricycles, etc.).



### Empowering Women : Vocational Training for Livelihood

#### Udyamita-VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

Imparting job-oriented training to community women and young girls is a major focus area for **PSP**. **VatsalyaGram** has two Vocational Training centres, **Udyamita**, that are being run specifically for young girls & women of nearby villages and slums.

VT Centre-1 : Making of Candle & Diya, Pickle, Jam, Tomato Sauce, Papad, Hair Conditioner, etc.

VT Centre-2 : Tailoring & Stitching, Beautician

The overarching initiative is to impart training under different vocations to allow the beneficiaries to be independent and contribute to the household income.

Life-skill training is integrated with the above vocations in order to inculcate the 3 Cs - confidence, courage & conviction among the beneficiaries to enable them to deal effectively with the demands & challenges of everyday life.

During the year 2015-16, 255 women & young girls from the neighbouring communities were provided free training across different vocations. Products so prepared by these beneficiaries are displayed and sold to visitors at the campus and part of the proceeds is shared with the beneficiaries.



### Empowering Girls : Personality Development Camps

#### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

We at **PSP** staunchly believe that when girls are educated and empowered, families, societies and even the nation will be healthier. Empowered girls are likely to not just bring progress for their own family but can also strengthen economies.

With this belief, PSP conducts personality development camps every year exclusively for girls at its Vrindavan campus. These PD-Camps are designed with an overarching aim to build confidence, courage and self-esteem among the young girls.

The Camp in this year was held from June 5 - 15, 2015 and saw 158 girls from different Indian states participating in the camp and taking back a lot of skills in addition to cherished memories.

During the 10-day regimen, participants were provided training on life-skills, sports, music & dance, yoga, self-defense and other confidence-building exercises to prepare these girls - physically, mentally & spiritually - to overcome life's challenges and obstacles, and live empowered lives.

The camp concluded with a mega cultural show with the participants mesmerizing the audience with plays, dance and other events.

**PSP** will continue to empower and educate girls to foster gender equality and more importantly to promote a healthier, more prosperous world.



### Mainstreaming Tribal Girls

#### VatsalyaGram-Omkareshwar



The second of the **VatsalyaGrams** at Omkareshwar in the state of M.P. exclusively serves backward tribal girls to help them be part of the mainstream society.

As on date 300 tribal girls are staying at this **VatsalyaGram** and obtaining quality formal education in the residential School Samvid Gurukulam Kanya Vidyalaya. In addition to education, these girls are also provided life-skill and

personality development training to help them be able to effectively deal with the issues and challenges they may encounter in their personal and professional lives.



The campus also has a Cow Barn (Gaushala) with approx. 50 cows (incl. calves) and the milk from these cows is served to the project girls as part of nutrition offering.

## Mainstreaming Children of BPL Category

### VatsalyaGram-Sijai

The third of the **VatsalyaGrams** at Sijai in the state of M.P. exclusively serves backward children coming from BPL (Below Poverty Line) families.

As on date 112 children of the poorest-of-the-poor are obtaining quality formal education in the School Samvid Gurukulam.

The School is presently functioning as a Primary School till Class IV from its building on Ground Floor. To ensure continuum of education and to bring a higher number of such children into the ambit of formal education **PSP** proposes to expand this existing School-building by adding 2 more floors, First Floor (Ph-II) & Second Floor (Ph-III) to the existing structure.



### Outreach Programs : Youth Development

#### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

With the belief that education and training of children & youth is the backbone of every society and a pathway out of poverty, PSP signed a Memorandum of Understanding with **ST Microelectronics** - a French-Italian MNC headquartered in Geneva (Switzerland) and a global leader in manufacturing of semiconductors - to impart basic computer literacy to community youth.

As part of this meaningful alliance, a Computer Lab was set up at **VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan** to impart basic computer literacy to the community youth, particularly those who are not at all acquainted with a computer. The youth will be mobilized by our team and the training (for which the course module has been provided by ST Micro Foundation) is imparted by a Trainer, specially recruited for the purpose. Trainees are also awarded a formal certification after successful completion of the course.



Already, around 50 community youth have successfully completed the course while the target is to train between 400 and 500 youth every year.

### Outreach Programs : Community Health

#### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

Every single year for almost a decade, **PSP** conducts free health camps (cataract, polio, dental) at **VatsalyaGram** exclusively for the impoverished members of the community and poorest of the poor. **PSP's** unique community health initiatives focus directly on communities that face limited or no access to quality healthcare and/or other socio-economic issues.

During this year, four Eye (Cataract) Camps were organized wherein almost 1000 cataract operations were done, completely free of cost. During these camps, the patients along with their attendants stay at the **VatsalyaGram** campus and are also provided with stay facilities as well as meals for the entire length of the camp.



### Uttarakhand Relief-Rehab-Development (RRD) Program

#### Vatsalya Sewa Centres-Rudraprayag

Param Shakti Peeth was amongst the many humanitarian organizations that responded to the Uttarakhand tragedy of June-2013, however, is amongst the very few ones who are still working in the disaster-affected region.

And from the very beginning, **PSP's** intent was (and still remains) to provide long-term and permanent rebuilding & rehabilitation support at the ground level and we have never faltered from that goal.

Post the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of responding with immediate relief, as part of phase 2 (Rehab.) & 3 (Development), we are:

- taking complete care of almost 150 children from the two (2) Vatsalya Care Centres (providing Shelter, Food & Nutrition, Healthcare, Education, & Overall Wellbeing);
- imparting skills and empowering around 500 women & young girls through the eleven (11) Vocational Training Centres established by us across 11 different affected villages;
- rendering need-based services and undertaking works & activities both at the individual level and community level to restore normalcy in the day-to-day lives of the target population.



### Uttarakhand Relief-Rehab-Development (RRD) Program

From the 11 Vocational Training Centres across 11 different affected villages, we are directly touching the lives of around 500 women & young girls, who come to these Centres to obtain skills in tailoring, stitching & embroidery. In doing so, they are not only being empowered to earn a living for themselves and their families but are being positively engaged to mitigate the trauma of the tragedy.



To introduce new and unique vocations to expand livelihood opportunities, we partnered with National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad (an autonomous institution under the aegis of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Govt. of India) for imparting training to young girls & women of the project villages (for producing Glass-bead Jewellery Articles).

As part of this meaningful association, team from NID conducted a third workshop (earlier two were conducted during the previous year) during this year in one of the intervened villages. Earlier, a 6-member group of women & girls from the project were also sent to the NID-Ahmedabad campus to help them gain confidence and advanced level of training in the vocation in question.



## Nepal-Disaster-Relief-Program

### Nepal

Proactively responding to the Nepal Earthquake, PSP immediately rushed its team to the affected areas in Nepal to support in relief/rescue operations, facilitate medical aid and distribute relief material (rations, water, clothes, blankets, tarpaulins, etc.) among the victims of the earthquake.

We also organized health camps in partnership with Sewa International, USA at multiple locations in the intervened regions. As part of the rehabilitation process, we built over hundred homes in two of the disaster-affected villages as many of these villagers were rendered homeless owing to large-scale damage.



### Vatsalya Mahotsav

#### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

The highlight of this year was clearly the Vatsalya Mahotsav (Feb 16 - 22, 2016) - a milestone to celebrate the journey of VatsalyaGram till now and the impacts it has created in this journey thus far. More importantly, the event was meant to bestow some of the new community initiatives of **PSP** to the nation and kick-start some other programs to bring more needy people into the ambit of Vatsalya care, all as part of the fourth phase of VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan, the flagship project of **PSP**.

The week-long event saw dignitaries from different spheres viz., politics, social, business, media, etc. visit VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan and be a part of a historical milestone.

#### Inauguration of Maa Kalawati Paalyam by Smt. Smriti Irani – Feb 16, 2016

Hon'ble Union HRD Minister Smt. Smriti Irani started the first of the series of formally handing-over of the nation-building community initiatives of **PSP** with the inauguration of a new Hostel Facility 'Maa Kalavati Paalyam' Girls' Hostel.

With a super area of 100,000 sq. ft. and a built-up area of 55,000 sq. ft., the Hostel facility will provide a safe and healthy environment for the girls who are obtaining education at Samvid Gurukulam Senior Secondary School. The Hostel consists of all kind of facilities including centrally air cooled rooms/ dormitories, mess facility with in-house kitchen, medical facility, multi-purpose hall, a recreation room and warden room.



Later, the Hon'ble Minister also felicitated well-wishers who had extended their valuable support for the construction of 'Maa Kalavati Paalyam' Girls' Hostel.

## Vatsalya Mahotsav

### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

#### Inauguration of Swami Parmanand Vatsalyam by Sh. Amit Shah – Feb 17, 2016



Sh. Amit Shah, National BJP President, took time out from his extremely hectic schedule to inaugurate 'Swami Parmanand Vatsalyam' – the new homes for Vatsalya families. These 16 new 2-BHK homes, built across 4 storeys (G+3) will accommodate 16 Vatsalya families, each family comprising of 7-8 children, a mother, an aunt and a grandmother.

Part of 'Gokulam' residential block, the new homes have a built-up area of 25,000 sq. ft. app. And will be fully equipped to provide all the facilities and amenities to the Vatsalya families who would stay here.

#### Foundation Stone of Maa Kalawati Paalyam (Ph.-2) by Smt. Sumitra Mahajan – Feb 18, 2016

While the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the 'Maa Kalavati Paalyam' Girls' Hostel is complete and now operational, keeping in view the future requirement whereby more girls will be staying at VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan for their education and creating a bright future for themselves, the foundation was also laid for the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of the Girls' Hostel. This was done by Hon'ble Lok Sabha Speaker Smt. Sumitra Mahajan.



The 2<sup>nd</sup> phase will be built over an app. area of 25,000 sq. ft. and accommodate an additional 200 girls, offering all the facilities developed under 1<sup>st</sup> phase.

## Vatsalya Mahotsav

### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

#### Inauguration of Brahmaarpan by Sh. Ramesh Chandra Lahoti – Feb 19, 2016

‘Brahmaarpan’ is a dedicated fully-equipped kitchen-cum-dining hall (built on an app. area of 10,000 sq. ft.) to prepare food for about 5,000 girls, with a seating capacity of 500 (i.e., can serve food to 500 at the same time).

Inaugurated by Hon’ble Sh. RC Lahoti, the 35<sup>th</sup> Chief Justice of India, the bhojanalaya is run and maintained by a team of cooks and helpers who work hard to make sure that the nutritional needs of the growing children are taken care.

Speaking on the occasion, Sh. Lahoti said, “I pray that the girls studying here grow up to make Didi Maa proud of her daughters’ achievements while also making India a proud nation”.



#### Inauguration of Neeramratam by Baba Ramdev – Feb 20, 2016



The fifth day of the Vatsalya Mahotsav saw two key programs being dedicated for the service of nation. The first of this was the inauguration of ‘Neeramratam’ RO Water Plants by Yog-guru Swami Ramdev.

Each of these RO Plant has a treatment capacity of 16,000 litres of water per hr. and will benefit between 3000 and 4000 people every day.

### Vatsalya Mahotsav

#### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

##### **Inauguration of Krishna Brahamratan Vidya Mandir (Ph.-2) by Sh. Nitin Gadkari – Feb 20, 2016**

The second program that was inaugurated on Feb 20 was the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of 'Krishna Brahamratan Vidya Mandir', a School exclusively meant for community children. This School provides formal education to children of BPL (Below Poverty Line) families who stay in neighbouring villages & slums. Other than the education, the children are also provided transportation, uniform & stationery, mid-day meals, and healthcare facilities (on need basis).

With additional classrooms being built under Ph.-2, more community children will be brought into the ambit of formal education thereby providing a veritable thrust to the national agenda of 'Education for All'.



The inauguration of the Ph.-2 was done by Sh. Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister of Road Transport and Highways and Shipping. An eminent humanitarian, spiritual teacher and visionary, Didi Maa Sadhvi Ritambhara, the President of **PSP**, is well known globally and respected for her spiritual discourses and social initiatives. She has dedicated her life to the wellbeing of fellow citizens, especially the disadvantaged and bottom-of-the-pyramid population.

Also present on this day for the inauguration were Gurudev Parmanand Ji Maharaj, Baba Ramdev, Sh. Brahamratan Agarwal (whose generous and meaningful contribution is the cornerstone of this initiative) with his wife Smt. Krishna Agarwal and their daughters Smt. Rohini Gupta and Smt. Savita Gupta.

### VatsalyaGram-Vrindavan

#### Inauguration of Mangal Manas & Meera Madhav Nilayam by Sh. Rajnath Singh – Feb 21, 2016

The Hon'ble Home Minister Sh. Rajnath Singh graced the Vatsalya Mahotsav on the second last day and inaugurated 'Mangal Manas' (a replica of Mount Kailash with the Cave Temple of Maa Sarvmangla) and 'Meera Madhav Nilayam' Guest-house that hosts our well-wishers and supporters from around the world. The Guest-house is built across 4 storeys and offers 40 well-appointed rooms & suites with delectable pure-veg. food to its guests.



Also present during the inauguration were Governor of Gujarat Sh. Om Prakash Kohli.

Sh. Rajnath Singh toured the facility and was visibly impressed by the infrastructure, the amenities, overall upkeep and the warm hospitality of the staff.






